Short Panel Description:

Digitalisation is driving a profound transformation in the railway sector, reshaping the way Capacity and Traffic Management are approached across Europe.

We are moving away from national, annual, and manual processes toward a **flexible**, **digital**, **and European** framework. This digital shift is transforming the landscape, powered by Telematics Technical Specifications for Interoperability (TSIs) and regulations.

Previously heterogeneous processes and systems of individual companies are now **harmonised and connected** to a central European system through clearly defined interfaces. Central systems, regulations, TSIs, and European financial support are key enablers of this transformation.

In this panel, we will explore the challenges of implementation and discuss how regulations, TSIs, and appropriate financial support can facilitate the digitalisation process.
