Short Panel Description:

Increased capacity on existing railway infrastructure and improving efficiency across the railway sector are essential for a more **market-oriented future**. Since 2019, RNE has been working towards these goals through the **Timetable Redesign (TTR) programme**.

For rail stakeholders, meeting **diverse demands** present unique challenges:

- Early, long-term planning is essential, yet the short-notice flexibility is also required. This is just one example of many **competing demands** that complicate the creation of a single, integrated process and corresponding IT framework.
- Despite the **lack of a supporting legal framework**, many RNE members have already developed initial Capacity Strategies and Models. This process underscores the sector's commitment but also highlights the need for increased effort, resources, and a formal Capacity Regulation to fully synchronise processes across Europe.

Join sector experts in this panel as they discuss **how to integrate diverse requirements** into a unified capacity management process, identify **critical gaps** still need solutions, and address **varying expectations** from different stakeholder groups.

Short Panel Description:

The **European Traffic Management Network (ETMN)** concept introduces a new perspective on **international train run management**.

It coordinates **train runs from origin to destination** through close cooperation between traffic control centres. On a day-to-day basis, this means that dispatcher can cooperate more effectively by exchanging **telematics TSI data**, supported by the **Train Information System (TIS)**. Additional activities, such as international contingency management, train run forecasting, and language-related initiatives, further strengthen the traffic management network.

This panel will foster interactive discussions between speakers and participants on the future of traffic management, focusing on the development of a **network of interconnected national dispatchers** with timely information and a shared communication language.

Short Panel Description:

Digitalisation is driving a profound transformation in the railway sector, reshaping the way Capacity and Traffic Management are approached across Europe.

We are moving away from national, annual, and manual processes toward a **flexible, digital, and European** framework. This digital shift is transforming the landscape, powered by Telematics Technical Specifications for Interoperability (TSIs) and regulations.

Previously heterogeneous processes and systems of individual companies are now **harmonised and connected** to a central European system through clearly defined interfaces. Central systems, regulations, TSIs, and European financial support are key enablers of this transformation.

In this panel, we will explore the challenges of implementation and discuss how regulations, TSIs, and appropriate financial support can facilitate the digitalisation process.
